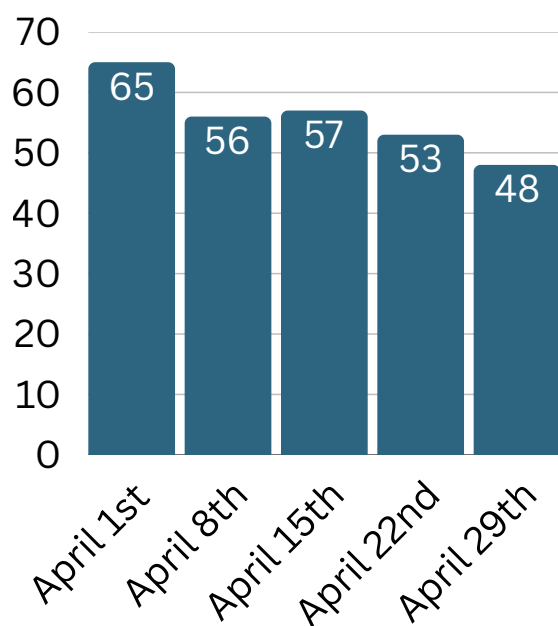

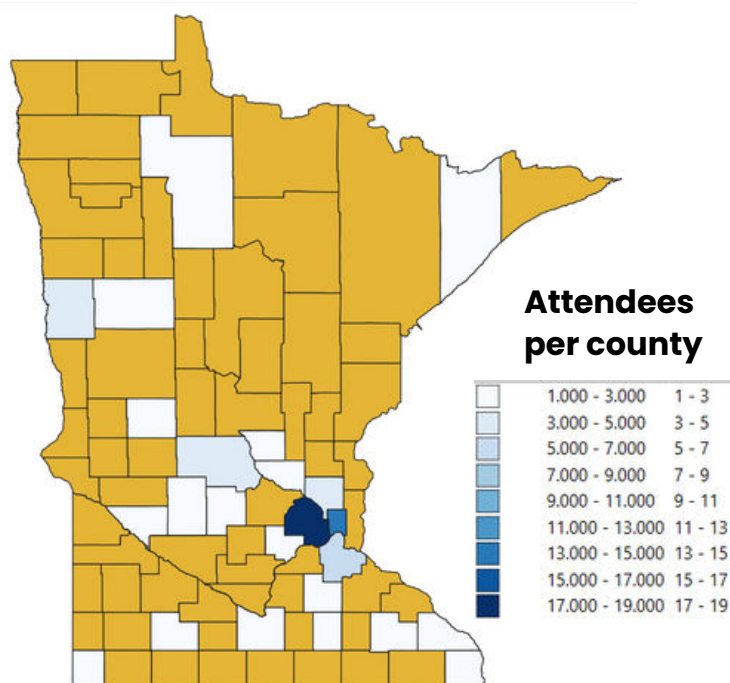

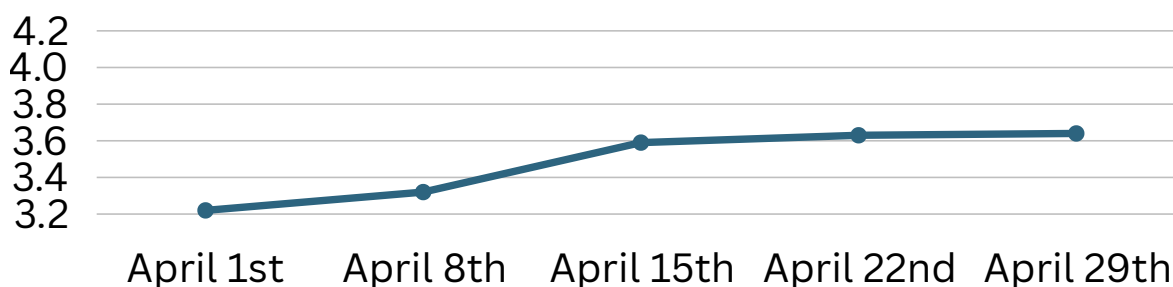
Attendance Dispersal Across the State



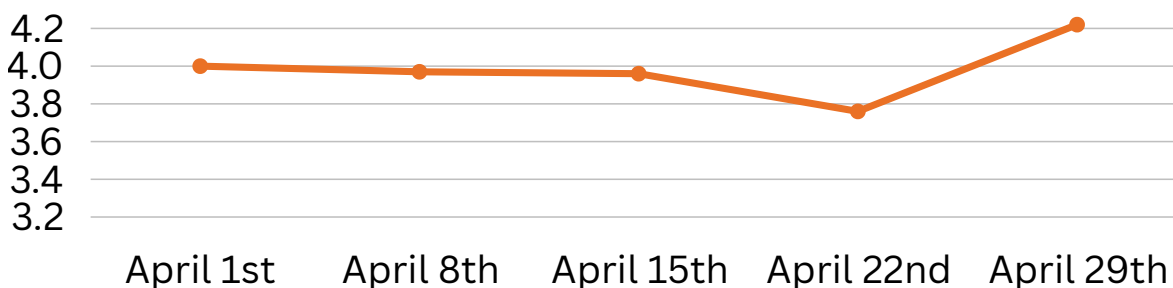
Webinar Polls

We asked the same two questions during each session in the series. Participants were asked to answer each question on a scale of 1-5. These line graphs show the average answer from each session.

Opening question: How knowledgeable are you about subminimum wage?



Closing question: How much did this session improve your understanding of subminimum wage?



We also send a survey out after the series was complete. 25 people completed this survey. We gathered information about the accessibility of the event and future training topic requests.

92% of survey respondents said they know more about subminimum wage after attending the series.
